CHARLES MCPHERSON at Dizzy's Club Coca-Cola (through March 4, 7:30 and 9:30 p.m.). In the 1960s, after the alto saxophonist Eric Dolphy departed from Charles Mingus's band, Mr. McPherson stepped in. He stayed with Mingus through the mid-1970s, and his ardent, chirruping attack — heavily influenced by Charlie Parker and Sonny Stitt — became a defining component of the ensemble. In

the years since, Mr. McPherson has hardly strayed from the path of bebop conservatism. He will perform in a stalwart quintet with the guitarist Yotam Silberstein, the pianist Jeb Patton, the bassist Todd Coolman and the drummer Jonathan Blake.
